Who Do You Serve?

“No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.” **Matthew 6:24** NASB

Master defined is: “He to whom a person or thing belongs, about which the master has the power of deciding, a lord.” God and Wealth are the two masters to which Jesus referred in this passage. God truly is master ruling over all creation, in heaven, on earth, and all realms of existence. Wealth, on the other hand, is not evil in its proper place and it has no kingdom to rule. How then can it be classified as a master?

The context of the word wealth in Matthew 6:24, refers to riches that have risen to the place of being personified and opposed to God. How does wealth become opposed to God, and take on a personage all its own? I am sure the process begins innocently enough, but anything that becomes opposed to God is sin. There is another god who is referred to in scripture as the god of this age, the devil, the father of lies, the deceiver, and he is the one who lords over all sin. Given half a chance the deceiver will manipulate anything and use it to oppose the one true God. Wealth is not a god, but a love of wealth that opposes God or becomes more important than God becomes twisted by the god of this age.

Things by themselves have no power to rule over us, but Romans 6:18 states, “Do you not know that when you present yourselves to someone as slaves for obedience, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness?” All of humanity lives each day under the realm of God’s lordship. Yet, God does not enforce His lordship over us, making us serve Him. Rather, God has set us in His kingdom in such a way that by our own desires and choices we can give lordship to who we want, whether it is sin or obedience to God. Sins present themselves in many forms and with many different temptations. Some develop into addictions; others present themselves as lusts, sinful habits, vain thoughts, vain philosophies, doctrines of demons, or false religions.

We are told in scripture to resist the devil, and to be watchful so we do not become entangled in the snare of the devil. We are warned in Ephesians 4:27 “Do not give the devil an opportunity.” Remember the old adage, “The devil is in the details.” Satan’s world is the world of sin and he is roaming around looking for whom he may devour. Wealth becomes a master only when we give the tempter opportunity through our wrong choices as he twists it before us thus becoming a god through his hidden deceptive involvement.

Be a good steward of your life. Romans 6 tells us we are no longer slaves to sin. We, as stewards, have the freedom and the responsibility to make Godly choices. Disciples of Jesus are expected to give of their time, talents, and substance. A watchful person pays attention to how time is best spent, is committed to the development of talents and skills, and understands the investment of resources in God’s kingdom reaps rewards of abundance in every area of life. Responsible stewardship is choosing to invest ourselves in God’s kingdom and this serves as active resistance of the snares of the evil one. So, let us seek first the kingdom of God and everything else will find its proper place in our lives.
