Engaged In Evangelism

Columbia Presbytery met Sunday April 27th at the Mt. Lebanon church. The Committee on Theology and Social Concerns submitted their report and asked each delegate to share the contents of the report with their congregation. The topic the committee addressed is Evangelism. The following is a condensed version of the paper from the committee entitled, “Engaged in Evangelism”.

“Due to the passage of time and other variables, every organization experiences change. One disturbing change in our Presbytery has been a drop in membership over the last decade. While long-lived organizations usually see gradual changes in membership, the reality is if an organization is not growing it is dying. In the case with churches, if we are not evangelizing all the time we are dying. It may take years. It may be delayed until all our current members die, but unless we bring others in we will die. We will consider three scripture texts to inspire, equip and empower us to share Christ with the people among whom God has placed us.

Bringing People to Jesus (Matt. 9:2-13, Mark 2:3-12, and Luke 5:17-26) All three passages record friends of a paralyzed man bringing him to Jesus. The essence of these passages is the friends had so much faith in the healing power of Jesus, and thought enough of their friend, that they were determined to get him into the presence of Jesus. The friends expected healing but got so much more as their friend received the forgiveness of his sins.

We should have so much confidence in Jesus that we look for opportunities to bring people into the presence of Christ. Needs can be financial, career, domestic, mental, emotional, social, or a host of other needs unique to each individual. Meeting earthly needs often opens the door to deeper needs. When meeting needs we never know when it will result in forgiveness of sin and salvation. Evangelism – bringing others to Jesus – should be the ultimate goal of everything we attempt.

Dealing with Division Contention, strife, and a lack of unity greatly undermine a church’s effectiveness at evangelism. Paul cautioned the Corinthian church that the wisdom of man deceives us and a wise man recognizes he is a fool before the Lord (1 Cor. 3:18-20). We are not to judge but leave it to the Lord (1 Cor. 4:4-5). Avoid being puffed up one against another and question who makes you different from another (1 Cor. 4:7). We are to speak the same thing, and have no divisions or contentions among brothers (1 Cor. 1:10). We labor together on the foundation of Christ and God will give the increase (1 Cor. 3:6-14).

Public Witness (Acts 17) We have kept our spiritual lives private. We may go to church on Sunday, but we don’t mention it Monday through Friday. Statistically, American Christians are hard to distinguish from non-believers in terms of morality, generosity, and lifestyle. In Acts 17 Paul was waiting in Athens for Silas and Timothy to rejoin him when he observed all kinds of things people worshiped. He began to interact with them in the synagogues and the marketplace. He most certainly did not follow our model of waiting until people came to church before he spoke to them about Jesus.

How effective would our evangelistic efforts be if in a respectful way we took note of all the things people worship and showed them how God, not their idols, is the answer to their needs? What if we are just as “Christian” in our daily lives as we are on Sunday? Our prayer is that God would help us shift our understanding of evangelism so we see it as who we are. May we bring those in who need to meet Christ. May we work together with purpose to bring in the harvest. May we live public spiritual lives intentionally sharing the Gospel of Christ. Lord, forgive us for leaving you alone in the fields of harvest. We are coming to join you!”
