Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. 36 But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. 37 All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. 38 For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. 39 And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. 40 For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day."41 At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." 42 They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"43 "Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. 44 "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day.

**Camping at Crystal Springs** 

The arrival of the month of June signifies the beginning of church camp season, and what better place to have a wonderful camp experience than Crystal Springs. It brings back so many memories for me and all of them good. O, I got in trouble a time or two down through the years, but slamming the outside window shutters on the girls' cabins in the middle of the night seemed like such a good idea at the time. We had corn on the cob for lunch the next day and the camp director made sure I personally shucked enough corn for the entire camp. I had a little help from my partners in crime.

I have been attending Crystal Springs church camp as a camper since 4th grade. I attended other camps prior to my 4th grade year, but only because mom was a counselor and she brought me along for the ride. I have worked in dozens of camps since college days, and most of those were at Crystal Springs.

Church camp at Crystal Springs has played a huge role in my spiritual development and I believe I can speak for all three of our children to the same effect. There is something special that happens during the camp experience. A community develops as the week unfolds, partly because of the distractions of outside life that have been removed, but mostly it is the relationships, the movement of the Spirit, and the prayers of so many people that make the camp experience unique.

I grew up in a small church that could not afford to have a youth pastor. I was one of three youth in my age group, the other two being girls with boyfriends who did not attend our church. They were so involved in relationships I could never talk them into going to church camp with me. So most of the time I was on my own.

Church camp was where I experienced Christian community for what felt like was the first time. I believe church camp is where I first realized I could be a Christian and have fun being a part of something so real. The only complaint I ever had about church camp was that it always came to an end to soon. My only frustration with camp was that I could never keep those fires of excitement and spiritual fervor burning at the same level once I returned home.

Years later, when God began to deal with me about my call to the ministry I began to see how many lessons God had taught me through all those years of camp. I cannot say enough good things about the value of sending your children to church camp. I know many young people, both male and female, who came to faith in Christ, or experienced the call to the ministry at church camp. I also have seen God's call realized by adult staff through years of service.

The board of Christian Education for Columbia Presbytery is always looking for people who are willing to give a week of their summer to work with our children and youth at church camp. I hope you never get the idea you are too old to give your time at church camp. It is a sacrifice, but you will receive a blessing you will never forget, and you may just experience a call from God.

Some of you may never be able to attend church camp but you can help others attend by providing financial scholarships for those who would not be able to attend camp any other way. You can find out how to help by speaking with someone from our Christian Ed. committee. May God keep each one safe this summer and bless our campers!
