Attitude Adjustment

Psalm 100:4-5

⁴Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him, bless His name. ⁵For the LORD is good; His loving kindness is everlasting and His faithfulness to all generations.

Giving thanks is a beautiful act of worship. The Psalmist believed thanksgiving is how one should enter into God's presence. We give thanks in our prayers, our songs, and our corporate confessions of faith, but thanksgiving is more than just the words we say or songs we sing. Giving of thanks is every action we take and the service we render from a grateful heart.

Colossians 4:2 reveals an attitude of thanksgiving that should be a part of our prayers. "Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with *an attitude of* thanksgiving." I believe the person who has an attitude of thanksgiving in their prayer life carries that same attitude into their everyday life and actions.

Thanksgiving Day was instituted in this country in large part because of one woman who had an attitude of thanksgiving burning in her heart. I hope Thanksgiving Day will always be a reminder to us to carry the attitude of thanksgiving in our heart everyday in everything we do.
