Luke 22:19-20 And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood.

Communion has always been a subject of such awe and wonder for me. I remember even as a young child watching people in the congregation taking communion and I would be passed by every time. What was this meal where all the adults could participate, but I could only look on and wonder? I asked my mom one day why I could not take communion with everyone else, and her reply was, as far as I can recall, the one most provocative statement responsible for producing a desire in me to take seriously the message of the Gospel. She said, "Well son, you cannot partake of this meal yet because you have not expressed your faith in Jesus. This meal is for those of the family of God who have already expressed faith in Christ."

I guess I thought they passed me by because I was a disinterested little kid who had hardly ever paid attention, which had been completely true until a recent curiosity had cropped up in me. O, but now I was keenly aware and terribly concerned. I thought I was a member of the church just like everybody else. I think part of my disinterest to that point was due to the fact that I thought I was already "IN" the family. Mom explained to me how I was a member of the church but I had to come to a place of faith in Jesus on my own, and only then would I be allowed to take Communion with the rest of the congregation.

It was at that moment, for the first time in my life, I realized I was not a believer in Jesus, and I had heard enough of my granddaddy's hellfire and brimstone preaching to know what that meant. It was such a strange sensation to be sitting in church one moment feeling a part of the family and the next realizing I was not in the innermost circle. I was upset. I turned to mom in the middle of communion and said, "Why didn't anybody tell be about this? I thought I was 'IN'"!

It was not long before I made my public profession in Jesus and was able to join in every aspect of the family of God especially the worship of God in the service of Holy Communion. I began to wonder what was really happening (in a spiritual sense) when I would receive The Lord's Supper. It was curiosity as a youngster, but as I grew in the Lord so did my desire to understand the mystery in this special meal.

The Lord's Supper was first observed on the evening of the Passover meal, which would be the last Jesus would share with his disciples during his earthly ministry. Jesus had sent Peter and John ahead to prepare the Passover. The Passover meal had a prescribed liturgy, but Jesus would change all of that on this special night. The bread Jesus described as His body, and the cup, in Luke's Gospel Jesus described as the New Covenant in His blood. The cup is described elsewhere in scripture as "the cup of blessing" (1 Corinthians 10:16).

The Passover meal was a prescribed ordinance from God commemorating God's deliverance of the children of Israel from Egypt. It was a meal of deliverance, and so is Holy Communion today. During the first Passover the people were to spread the blood of a lamb or young goat on the door post, and the Lord would see the blood and pass over them so none of their first born would be harmed. Jesus by drawing attention to the cup as the New Covenant in His blood was signifying how his blood, in only a matter of a couple of days, would be the blood of salvation and deliverance for all who would believe.

Remember, when you observe Holy Communion you proclaim the Lord's death, which is all about the punishment of His body and the spilling of His blood. The next time you observe Communion proclaim His body broken for you and His blood shed for you. Remember it is the cup of blessing. Proclaim and take hold of the blessing, for you have been blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ Jesus. Lay your burdens down, lay your chains at the foot of the cross, every worry, every fear, every broken heart, and declare that your deliverance has been secured as a partaker of the New Covenant. Expect this meal to carry with it the power of deliverance. The children of Israel were told to eat the first Passover in haste and to even be dressed to be ready to leave Egypt. We should approach the communion table with the same sense of expectation. Expect God to meet you at the table and administer every benefit of the New Covenant on your behalf. Some might think, "I have never experienced anything like that during Communion" and the proper response would be, "but have I ever approached the communion table with such an expectation?"
