A note from the Pastor...

At our twice yearly Presbytery meetings, candidates for the ministry often give the day's devotion. It's a way of introducing themselves to the presbytery while giving glory to God. It's usually intimidating for the preachers-inpreparation because they are preaching in front of what will become their peers. What do you preach to people who preach every Sunday?

This past meeting the honor went to Rev. Hone Phillips, an ordained minister of the Reformed Churches of New Zealand who desires to be ordained in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and he showed us that he had no fear at all to preach!

His sermon introduced the idea that Jesus explained to the world exactly who God is. In it he said that when Jesus walked and talked and lived and taught and healed and on and on, what he was also doing was revealing God to the world so that if someone took a look, they discern what God is about.

I'd heard before that to know Jesus is to know God but somehow that never really grabbed me like maybe it should.

Yet, when Rev. Phillips said it like he did, his words sunk into me and told me a truth I don't think I'd really grasped before. If you want to know the intimate thoughts of God, God's motivations, God's values, and what God finds important, it is readily available. You just have to see what Jesus showed us.

I think the temptation (or sadly, what we've often been taught) is that all we must do is know that Jesus was God in the flesh, and believe he died on a cross for us, only to be resurrected. We are deceived and think that to know that is to know enough.

Rev. Phillips reminded us that it is not though. To truly know God is to become intimate with the scriptures so that we can know exactly what it is that <mark>Jesus did. Wh</mark>en we know what he taught, we know what God needs us to know. When we know what he did, we learn what God finds it good to do. When we know how he lived, we can find our own path to walk in the world.

To know Jesus is to know what God is all about. As Rev. Hone Phillips preached, I came to realize the depth of that statement.

Might we all need to reminded that had Jesus' death and resurrection been all that mattered, he could have died as a baby, and been raised up then? So that can't be all there is.

The rest of the story is that God gave us a way to know all we need to know about God, when Jesus lived among us.

So let us learn more, by studying Jesus in scripture. Let us learn all we can, so that we can better know God, and come to love God even more.



We have several projects in the planning phase for the next several months.


